The 65th World Baden-Powell Fellowship Event

The American Chapter of the World Baden-Powell Fellowship has the pleasure to invite Baden-Powell Fellows from around the world to join His Majesty the King of Sweden, Honorary Chairman of the World Scout Foundation, for an inaugural Scouting event at the Boy Scouts of America's 2013 National Scout Jamboree at the Summit Bechtel Family National Scout Reserve. In our Fellowship tradition, during this event we will welcome new members of the Fellowship and recognize those who are moving through the Honours Programme.

A WORLD BADEN-POWELL FELLOWSHIP EVENT

Baden-Powell Fellows have the opportunity to meet to celebrate Scouting at two or sometimes three events a year. This can also be an opportunity to learn more about Scouting in a particular country (especially at the BSA's

new permanent jamboree location where the world Scout jamboree will be held in 2019), see friends, and make new ones. Each event is hosted by a national chapter of Baden-Powell Fellows.

LOCATION AND DATES

The event takes place at the national Scout jamboree in Beckley, West Virginia, and The Greenbrier in White Sulphur Springs, West Virginia, from July 18 to 21. The Greenbrier is a little over an hour from the jamboree site.

The American Chapter has reserved hotel rooms at The Greenbrier (www.greenbrier.com), which is a National Historic landmark about 60 miles from the Summit. See the Hotel and Travel Form for registration information.

TRANSPORTATION

Please note that the closest airport is Greenbrier Valley Airport (LWB) in Lewisburg, West Virginia. Pickup at this private airport by The Greenbrier can be arranged for a fee. Local regional airports are Roanoke Regional Airport (ROA) in Roanoke, Virginia, where pickup by The Greenbrier can be arranged for a fee, and Yeager Airport (CRW) in Charleston, West Virginia, which is a two-hour

drive by rental car. The closest international airport is Charlotte/Douglas International Airport (CLT) in Charlotte, North Carolina, which is a three- to four-hour drive by rental car. Valet (fee) and self-park (no charge) parking options are available at The Greenbrier.

PROGRAM

Thursday, July 18

Arrival and registration of guests at The Greenbrier.

In the late afternoon there will be a welcome reception at The Greenbrier for all the Baden-Powell Fellows. The dress code for this reception is smart casual (sports coat without tie).

In the evening there will be a special dinner for members of the Regal Circle for which personal invitations will be sent. The dress code for this dinner is smart casual (sports coat without tie).

Friday, July 19

The American Chapter and the BSA's 2013 National Scout Jamboree invite you to an exceptional opportunity to spend most of the morning through midday as a part of the first jamboree at the new permanent site. The dress code for the visit to the jamboree is Scout uniform (or casual).

This includes a visit to the jamboree site, tour of the Summit Center, lunch at the jamboree site, and visit to the exhibit area, as well as the opportunity to experience a Messengers of Peace service project.

The Greenbrier will serve as the location for our Baden-Powell Fellowship dinner that evening. Instead of the formal dress code of black tie, the dress code this time—Denim and Diamonds—will be more befitting the setting of the event: jeans, cowboy boots, cowboy hat, sports jacket, and dress shirt for men; jeans or denim skirt and dress shirt for women. And don't forget your diamonds to add flair to your outfit.

Transportation to and from the jamboree for those attending the jamboree as participants, adult leaders, and staff will be included with the dinner-only option. There are additional rooms available for those who want to stay.

Saturday, July 20

Activities at The Greenbrier will be offered until early afternoon. See the Event Registration Form for details. This stunning property has something for everyone to enjoy. Lunch will be at The Greenbrier.

A workshop will be offered to discuss the fundraising operation for the jamboree site, how the site was created, and how it will be developed in the coming years to host the 2019 World Scout Jamboree.

In the late afternoon we invite you once more to the site of the national Scout jamboree for a backstage dinner and to enjoy the event's closing ceremony. Again the dress code for the visit to the jamboree is Scout uniform (or casual).

Sunday, July 21

Departure from The Greenbrier.
